Registration is a **TWO** Step Process

1. Register for each course using the link below
2. Use the registration link in your confirmation email to complete the Zoom registration

You will immediately be directed to the course Zoom information page, including the link to access the course. Save this information. You can also add the event information to your calendar from this page.

WEA's Inclusionary Practices Project (IPP) and Special Education Support Center (SESC) are providing professional development via Zoom. Register for each course, using the link listed for each course. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email with the Zoom pre-registration link. Once registration is full, your registration is added to an automatic waitlist. If a spot opens, you will be notified via email.

Courses are available to all. Courses are free. Clock hours will be provided within 7-10 business days from the end of the course.

Youth Mental Health First Aid (8 hours)

2 separate sessions. You only need to sign up for one session.

Youth Mental Health Aid is a nationally recognized course that uses a learning management system, MHFA Connect, for your prework, live session, and course completion. After registering, you will receive three emails:

1. Registration Confirmation
2. An invitation to create your account and profile in the MHFA Connect platform. This is where you will access the course prework, materials, and zoom link to access the live sessions.
3. Confirmation you have been enrolled in the course.

Once you have enrolled in the course, you will be able to complete your 2 hours of prework. Pework must be completed 48 hours prior to the start of the first live session or you will be unenrolled. You are welcome to register for another course at a later date. Each course has a limited capacity of 30 registrants. If we do not have a minimum of 15 registrants that have completed the prework, the course will be cancelled.

Inclusive Communication with Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) in the General Education Classroom (6 hours)

Do you know how to support students with complex communication needs in your classroom? Are you looking for strategies to support learners across educational environments? This course will detail practical strategies you can implement immediately to support students who use Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) to communicate. Participants will learn how to include students with complex communication and physical needs in general education learning activities by using no-tech to high-tech tools, modifying existing activities, and implementing a handful of strategies that can be used throughout the day. Video examples, planning worksheets, and sample low tech AAC tools will be shared.

Effective High-Quality Present Levels of Academic Achievement and Functional Performance (PLAAFPs) for Strength-Based IEPs (9 Hours)

This course is intended for learners who have a general understanding of the elements of an Individual Education Program (IEP). Participants will focus on the application of essential components for developing Present Levels of Academic Achievement and Functional Performance (PLAAFP) statements to create strength-based IEPs through the support structure of a professional learning community (PLC)/collaborative small groups. Learners will have opportunities to examine their mindsets surrounding equity and inclusive practices.

Learners will also develop skills to author effective, meaningful PLAAFP statements for all students with disabilities to help drive student progress. This presentation requires active participation and engagement through small group discussion, chat reflections and discussions.

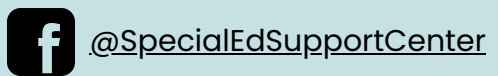
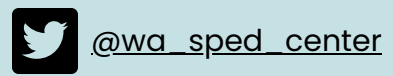
